COLLECTION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
PLACER COUNTY WATER AGENCY
AND
USDA FOREST SERVICE
TAHOE NATIONAL FOREST
AND
ELDORADO NATIONAL FOREST

THIS COLLECTION AGREEMENT is entered into by and between Placer County Water Agency, hereinafter referred to as AGENCY; and the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Forest Service, Tahoe National Forest and Eldorado National Forest, hereinafter referred to as SERVICE; under the provisions of the Granger-Thye Act of April 24, 1950 (16 U.S.C. 572).

I. PURPOSE:

The purpose of this agreement is to establish a fiscal plan between the AGENCY and SERVICE for the administration, operation, maintenance, repair, renewal, and replacement, as may be necessary, of the recreation facilities developed in conjunction with AGENCY'S Middle Fork American River Project. This plan relates to an AGENCY and SERVICE agreement executed respectively on July 29, 1965 and August 3, 1965 entitled AGREEMENT BETWEEN PLACER COUNTY WATER AGENCY AND THE UNITED STATES FOREST SERVICE FOR THE ADMINISTRATION, OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF RECREATION FACILITIES ON THE MIDDLE FORK AMERICAN RIVER PROJECT ON THE ELDORADO AND TAHOE NATIONAL FORESTS.

The AGENCY is responsible, under its Federal Energy Regulatory Commission license, for providing and maintaining facilities including campgrounds, picnic areas, roads, parking areas, water systems, sanitary facilities, boat ramps and beach areas to accommodate project recreation plan uses within the Project Area.

The SERVICE does not have funds to carry out its obligations under the 1965 agreement. Section C.4. provides "That any period in which federal appropriations do not permit the Service to carry out its obligations, the Service will permit the Agency, pursuant to the provisions of Section 7 of the Granger-Thve Act (16 USC 580d), to administer, operate, and maintain the recreation facilities at the Agency's expense."

Project facilities and areas are listed in Exhibit A of this agreement.

In consideration of the above premises, the parties hereto agree as follows:

II. THE AGENCY SHALL:

1. <u>ADVANCE PAYMENT BY COOPERATOR TO FOREST SERVICE</u>. Upon presentation of a Bill for Collection, make an advance deposit in the amount as shown on the attached exhibit for the purpose of paying costs associated with the administration, operation, maintenance, repair, renewal, and replacement of the recreation facilities. This amount includes required overhead

assessment at a rate of 19.5%. Exhibit B attached hereto, and by this reference incorporated herein, displays the breakdown of these costs.

- 2. Upon presentation of a Bill for Collection, make semi-annual (January/July) deposits to SERVICE in accordance with Exhibit B, Financial Project Plan.
- 3. Recognize that the Financial Project Plan is based on estimates and from time to time SERVICE'S actual needs may exceed these estimates, for various reasons. Should SERVICE'S needs exceed the estimates, SERVICE may bill AGENCY for additional operating funds as called for by the SERVICE to meet the actual costs of the operating year. The total amount paid by AGENCY shall not exceed the GRAND TOTAL shown on Exhibit B. If the AGENCY has any available funds, the AGENCY would review the SERVICE'S request for additional funds and make a decision.

III. THE SERVICE SHALL:

1. <u>ADVANCE BILLING</u>. Bill the cooperator prior to commencement of work for deposits sufficient to cover the estimated costs (including overhead) for the specific payment period. Overhead will be assessed at the rate of 19.5%.

- 2. Submit separate semi-annual billings (January/July) to the AGENCY for advance deposits to cover the work items in the annual Financial Project Plan, Exhibit B, for the respective Eldorado and Tahoe National Forest portions of the project.
- 3. Deposit the payments received from the Cooperator into a Forest Service cooperative work fund.
- 4. Annually, by February 1, submit an estimate of its budgetary needs to the AGENCY for its use in preparing budget requests for the next three fiscal years. AGENCY and SERVICE thereafter will meet as necessary during the month to finalize budget estimates by March 1 for the following year. The jointly developed proposed budget for SERVICE'S next fiscal year will become the annual revision of the Financial Project Plan, Exhibit B, of this agreement, in accordance with IV.1 of this agreement. The Tahoe National Forest will take the lead for SERVICE in coordinating this aspect of this Agreement.
- 5. Recognize that the Financial Project Plan is based on estimates and from time to time SERVICE'S actual needs may be less than these estimates, for various reasons. Should SERVICE'S needs be less than the annual estimates, SERVICE with the AGENCY approval will apply such excess funds toward this next operating year and reflect the carry-over in the subsequent Financial Project Plan. Absent the AGENCY'S approval, the excess funds will be returned to the AGENCY.

- 6. Recognize that the Financial Project Plan is based on estimates and from time to time SERVICE'S actual needs may exceed these estimates, for various reasons. Should SERVICE'S needs exceed the estimates, SERVICE may request AGENCY approval for additional operating funds as called for by the SERVICE to meet the actual costs of the operating year. SERVICE recognizes request for additional funds is dependent on AGENCY's availability of funds.
- 7. By January 1 of the following year, provide expenditure and work accomplishment information in the format required by AGENCY to meet its accounting requirements.

IV. IT IS MUTUALLY UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED UPON BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES THAT:

- 1. <u>MODIFICATION</u>. Modifications within the scope of the instrument shall be made by mutual consent of the parties, by the issuance of a written modification, signed and dated by all parties, prior to any changes being performed.
- 2. <u>PROPERTY IMPROVEMENTS</u>. Improvements placed on National Forest System land at the direction of either of the parties, shall thereupon become property of the United States, and shall be subject to the same regulations and administration of the Forest Service as other National Forest improvements of a similar nature. No part of this instrument shall entitle the cooperator to any share or interest in the project other than the right to use and enjoy the same under the existing regulations of the Forest Service.
- 3. <u>PARTICIPATION IN SIMILAR ACTIVITIES</u>. This instrument in no way restricts the Forest Service or the Cooperator(s) from participating in similar activities with other public or private agencies, organizations, and individuals.

COLLECTION AGREEMENT BETWEEN PLACER COUNTY WATER AGENCY AND USDA FOREST SERVICE TAHOE NATIONAL FOREST AND ELDORADO NATIONAL FOREST

THIS COLLECTION AGREEMENT is entered into by and between Placer County Water Agency, hereinafter referred to as AGENCY; and the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Forest Service, Tahoe National Forest and Eldorado National Forest, hereinafter referred to as SERVICE; under the provisions of the Granger-Thye Act of April 24, 1950 (16 U.S.C. 572).

I. PURPOSE:

The purpose of this agreement is to establish a fiscal plan between the AGENCY and SERVICE for the administration, operation, maintenance, repair, renewal, and replacement, as may be necessary, of the recreation facilities developed in conjunction with AGENCY'S Middle Fork American River Project. This plan relates to an AGENCY and SERVICE agreement executed respectively on July 29, 1965 and August 3, 1965 entitled AGREEMENT BETWEEN PLACER COUNTY WATER AGENCY AND THE UNITED STATES FOREST SERVICE FOR THE ADMINISTRATION, OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF RECREATION FACILITIES ON THE MIDDLE FORK AMERICAN RIVER PROJECT ON THE ELDORADO AND TAHOE NATIONAL FORESTS.

The AGENCY is responsible, under its Federal Energy Regulatory Commission license, for providing and maintaining facilities including campgrounds, picnic areas, roads, parking areas, water systems, sanitary facilities, boat ramps and beach areas to accommodate project recreation plan uses within the Project Area.

The SERVICE does not have funds to carry out its obligations under the 1965 agreement. Section C.4. provides "That any period in which federal appropriations do not permit the Service to carry out its obligations, the Service will permit the Agency, pursuant to the provisions of Section 7 of the Granger-Thye Act (16 USC 580d), to administer, operate, and maintain the recreation racilities at the Agency's expense."

Project facilities and areas are listed in Exhibit A of this agreement.

In consideration of the above premises, the parties hereto agree as follows:

II. THE AGENCY SHALL:

1. <u>ADVANCE PAYMENT BY COOPERATOR TO FOREST SERVICE</u>. Upon presentation of a Bill for Collection, make an advance deposit in the amount as shown on the attached exhibit for the purpose of paying costs associated with the administration, operation, maintenance, repair, renewal, and replacement of the recreation facilities. This amount includes required overhead

assessment at a rate of 19.5%. Exhibit B attached hereto, and by this reference incorporated herein, displays the breakdown of these costs.

- 2. Upon presentation of a Bill for Collection, make semi-annual (January/July) deposits to SERVICE in accordance with Exhibit B, Financial Project Plan.
- 3. Recognize that the Financial Project Plan is based on estimates and from time to time SERVICE'S actual needs may exceed these estimates, for various reasons. Should SERVICE'S needs exceed the estimates, SERVICE may bill AGENCY for additional operating funds as called for by the SERVICE to meet the actual costs of the operating year. The total amount paid by AGENCY shall not exceed the GRAND TOTAL shown on Exhibit B. If the AGENCY has any available funds, the AGENCY would review the SERVICE'S request for additional funds and make a decision.

III. THE SERVICE SHALL:

1. <u>ADVANCE BILLING</u>. Bill the cooperator prior to commencement of work for deposits sufficient to cover the estimated costs (including overhead) for the specific payment period. Overhead will be assessed at the rate of 19.5%.

- 2. Submit separate semi-annual billings (January/July) to the AGENCY for advance deposits to cover the work items in the annual Financial Project Plan, Exhibit B, for the respective Eldorado and Tahoe National Forest portions of the project.
- 3. Deposit the payments received from the Cooperator into a Forest Service cooperative work fund.
- 4. Annually, by February 1, submit an estimate of its budgetary needs to the AGENCY for its use in preparing budget requests for the next three fiscal years. AGENCY and SERVICE thereafter will meet as necessary during the month to finalize budget estimates by March 1 for the following year. The jointly developed proposed budget for SERVICE'S next fiscal year will become the annual revision of the Financial Project Plan, Exhibit B, of this agreement, in accordance with IV.1 of this agreement. The Tahoe National Forest will take the lead for SERVICE in coordinating this aspect of this Agreement.
- 5. Recognize that the Financial Project Plan is based on estimates and from time to time SERVICE'S actual needs may be less than these estimates, for various reasons. Should SERVICE'S needs be less than the annual estimates, SERVICE with the AGENCY approval will apply such excess funds toward this next operating year and reflect the carry-over in the subsequent Financial Project Plan. Absent the AGENCY'S approval, the excess funds will be returned to the AGENCY.

- 6. Recognize that the Financial Project Plan is based on estimates and from time to time SERVICE'S actual needs may exceed these estimates, for various reasons. Should SERVICE'S needs exceed the estimates, SERVICE may request AGENCY approval for additional operating funds as called for by the SERVICE to meet the actual costs of the operating year. SERVICE recognizes request for additional funds is dependent on AGENCY's availability of funds.
- 7. By January 1 of the following year, provide expenditure and work accomplishment information in the format required by AGENCY to meet its accounting requirements.

IV. IT IS MUTUALLY UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED UPON BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES THAT:

- 1. <u>MODIFICATION</u>. Modifications within the scope of the instrument shall be made by mutual consent of the parties, by the issuance of a written modification, signed and dated by all parties, prior to any changes being performed.
- 2. <u>PROPERTY IMPROVEMENTS</u>. Improvements placed on National Forest System land at the direction of either of the parties, shall thereupon become property of the United States, and shall be subject to the same regulations and administration of the Forest Service as other National Forest improvements of a similar nature. No part of this instrument shall entitle the cooperator to any share or interest in the project other than the right to use and enjoy the same under the existing regulations of the Forest Service.
- 3. <u>PARTICIPATION IN SIMILAR ACTIVITIES</u>. This instrument in no way restricts the Forest Service or the Cooperator(s) from participating in similar activities with other public or private agencies, organizations, and individuals.
